## PLAINTIFFS' MOTION FOR A PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION

Plaintiffs, by their undersigned counsel, respectfully move that this Court: (1) set an immediate hearing date for; and (2) grant a preliminary injunction requiring the defendant state officials and defendant Controller to pay on a timely basis the bills and vouchers already submitted and not paid and that will be submitted by the plaintiff organizations for the duration of the fiscal year. If deemed appropriate by this Court, plaintiffs request that this motion for a preliminary injunction be advanced as a hearing for a permanent injunction on the merits. In support of this motion, plaintiffs states as follows:

- 1. Plaintiffs have contemporaneously filed a motion seeking leave to file a memorandum of law in excess of ten pages that sets forth the grounds for preliminary injunctive relief.
- 2. Plaintiffs have also attached the affidavits of Gary Huelsmann, the CEO of Caritas Family Solutions, located in Belleville Illinois; Charley Smith, the Executive Director of Haven Youth and Family Services; and Nora Collins-Mandeville, the policy director of the Illinois Collaboration on Youth.
- 3. As set forth in the memorandum of law, the plaintiff organizations meet the prerequisites for a preliminary injunction.

4. Plaintiffs have an ascertainable right to payment—a payment right that is

undisputed by defendants.

5. From lack of timely payment, or any payment, plaintiffs are suffering irreparable

injury to their capacity to deliver services to the needy of this State and perform their

organizational missions.

6. Plaintiffs have no adequate remedy at law in the Court of Claims or for legal

relief in damages.

7. Plaintiffs are likely to succeed on the merits of their legal claims that the

defendant officers have acted in excess of their authority and abused the powers of their office

and should be liable for prospective injunctive relief. Furthermore, the defendants—in the so-

called "Stop Gap," Public Act 99-524—have impaired the obligation of contracts in violation of

Article I, section 16 of the Illinois Constitution. Defendants have also impaired the obligation of

contracts by operating the State and routinely entering contacts with third parties without the

budget required by Article VIII of the Illinois Constitution.

WHEREFORE plaintiffs move that this Court grant the relief sought above.
